Dancing with God

Holy, holy, holy, Lord God Almighty!

Early in the morning our song shall rise to thee: holy, holy, holy, merciful and mighty, God in three Persons, blessed Trinity!

Holy, holy, holy! All the saints adore thee, casting down their golden crowns around the glassy sea; cherubim and seraphim falling down before thee, who wert, and art, and evermore shalt be.

Holy, holy, holy! Though the darkness hide thee, though the sinful human eye thy glory may not see, only thou art holy; there is none beside thee, perfect in power, in love, and purity.

Holy, holy, holy, Lord God Almighty! All thy works shall praise thy name in earth and sky and sea; holy, holy, holy, merciful and mighty, God in three Persons, blessed Trinity! Reginald Heber



This Sunday, the Sunday after Pentecost is Trinity Sunday and the Gospel reading set for today is Matthew 28: 16-20. In these verses, Jesus sends his disciples out in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit...a form of words which we use to describe the Trinity... to describe God who is One in Three. And if you find the

idea of the Trinity a hard one to grasp, just how can God be One and Three at the same time, don't worry. It took the early church over 300 years to work it out in what we know as The Nicene Creed, which states that Jesus is "of one Being with the Father" and the Spirit "proceeds from the Father and the Son." One in Three. That's the difficult bit for today.

What I'd like to share with you now is one way of looking at the Trinity, which works for me. And it's based on the work of the theologian, Paul Fiddes. So, I'd like you to picture three separate people. These people are now going to hold hands and form a circle. It's difficult to tell where a circle begins and ends. As you look at the circle, it's not easy to tell

where one person begins and ends in the circle. Three separate people become one in the circle. And the circle dances. So it is with the Trinity. God who is Father...God who is Son...God who is Holy Spirit...they hold hands together and they become one. One in Three. And, they, too, dance. The Trinity dances together. As someone who loves dancing, I love that

image. The Trinity dances together. But, that's not all. This is not an exclusive dance for the Trinity alone. As followers of God who comes to us in Jesus, we are caught up in the dance and we become part of it. We become part of the life of God, as he lives in us. And that's where our reading from Matthew comes in.

When Jesus sends his disciples out, he sends them out in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. He sends them out to be a part of the life and purpose of God...to be part of the divine dance. How wonderful and awesome is that? The doctrine of the Trinity isn't easy to explain and we can't do it full justice in fewer that 500 words. But, don't forget, the Trinity isn't just a difficult idea...it's also the place where we dance with God. Amen.
