Crowds, then and now.

Mark 6: 30-34,53-56

As crowds return after lockdown, how might we emulate Jesus' compassion for the crowd? (Mark 6.34)

Last weekend we saw close to capacity crowds watching the Wimbledon tennis finals and the Euro football final at Wembley with few wearing masks. On 19 July almost all Covid-19 legal restrictions in England come to an end and crowds may again seem normal after 15 months without them. In churches we have stayed 'socially distanced', worn our masks and accepted that we cannot sing. Many, perhaps most, will wish to maintain at least some precautions particularly as case numbers rise.

Minorities within the crowds forced their way into Wembley Stadium and continue to taunt England's black footballers with racist abuse, at least on social media. Marcus Rashford wrote: 'I can take critique of my performance all day long, my penalty was not good enough, it should have gone in but I will never apologise for who I am and where I came from'. Rashford's colleague, Tyrone Mings, has attacked the Government – and specifically the Home Secretary – for failure to condemn those who booed when the team took the knee. I recommend Joe Aldred's Facebook post of 13 July, which includes these words 'good people everywhere, let's drain the racist swamp until what's at the bottom becomes clear and identified for what it is and they are. Humanity deserves better.'
